A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As you will see in the report that follows, this year ends with a significant increase in our efforts to collect and distribute foodstuffs. To the great joy of Moisson Montréal's member organizations and the people we serve, proteins will now play an important role in the variety of products that we distribute.

It is also interesting to note that the financial value of foodstuffs distributed by Moisson Montréal has doubled over the last five years, increasing from \$40 million to over \$80 million this year. This impressive growth, as well as the introduction of regular protein distribution, has kept our team of employees, volunteers and the entire network busy in the fight against food insecurity.

We could not be more grateful to our employees and volunteers, and to our donors, whether they gave foodstuffs or financial donations. Our volunteers alone generously gave over 85,000 hours of their time this year. Donors of food items, large supermarket chains and other agrifood businesses also played an instrumental role in this success.

We would like to extend our warmest gratitude and congratulations to the 254 member organizations that benefit from our food bank services and that provide front-line services in the battle against hunger. This food distribution network is at the heart of everything we do and the reason why we do it. Thanks to all these individuals, 14.2 million kilos of food were recovered this year and redistributed to those living in food insecurity.

Last year, **14.2 million kilos of foodstuffs** were distributed, free of charge, to our partner organizations, which enabled them to see massive savings of **\$81.5 million** (34% increase over last year).

Nearly 8,900 volunteers gave more than **85,700 hours** of their time to help us fulfill our mission - essential support that is the equivalent of 47 full-time employees!

Thanks to full-scale reductions in our expenses, as well as our food recovery programs with **304 agrifood businesses** and **113 supermarkets**, Moisson Montréal was able to distribute **\$15 worth of foodstuffs for every \$1 donated**.

A STIMULATING ENVIRONMENT FOR VOLUNTEERS

Moisson Montréal believes in equality for all and is especially mindful of social and professional inclusion. 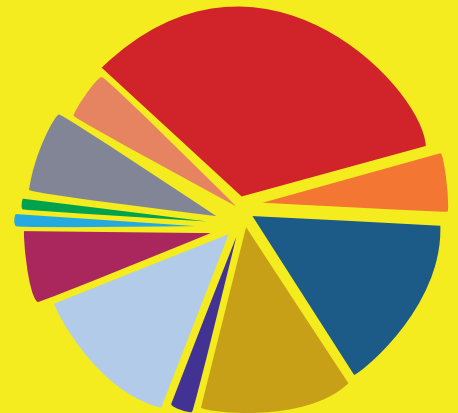

16,000 CHRISTMAS BASKETS DISTRIBUTED!

As part of our annual Feed the Holiday Spirit campaign, 242 corporate food drives raised nearly 29,500 kilos of foodstuffs and \$44,000 for the making of almost 16,000 Christmas baskets.

And as we do every year, this campaign wrapped up with Christmas Harvest, an event in which 250 volunteers come together to assemble 12,350 emergency food assistance packages, made possible by donations from the Grande guignolée des médias.

Moisson Montréal is a member of the Food Banks of Quebec network (FBQ) and has the infrastructure required to, as well as the mandate to, share foodstuffs received through this network, and on behalf of the FBQ, with the 18 other Moisson in Quebec. This year, 2,851,844 kg of food have been shared with the other Moissons in addition to 1,941,460 kg of food given by Moisson Montréal.

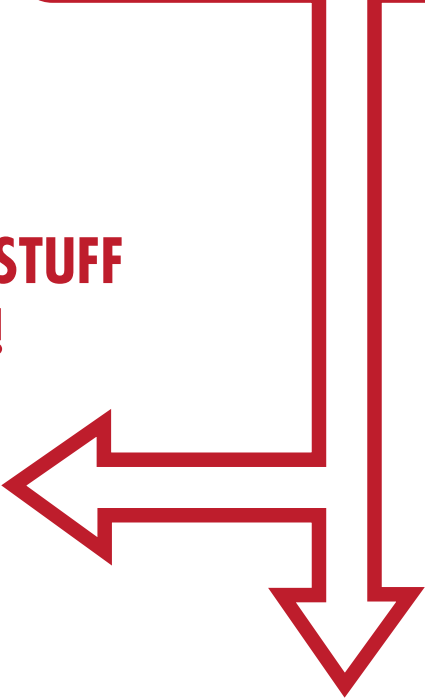

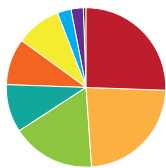

THE POWER OF A NETWORK THAT HELPS ITSELF

Moisson Montréal serves more than 250 accredited community organizations and 50 occasional organizations across the island of Montreal. These organizations, which offer a variety of front-line services, are provided with foodstuffs that meet the specific needs of their clientele.

LISTENING TO WHAT OUR ORGANIZATIONS NEED

We regularly conduct follow-ups, activities and surveys with our partner organizations to ensure their satisfaction, better understand their needs and gauge the situation of food insecurity in Montreal.

This year, Moisson Montréal organized the 4th annual Journée sur la lutte contre la faim in order to get a full portrait of food insecurity in Montreal. Eighty organizations came together to network and discuss issues relating to food insecurity.

One problem in our network was a lack of bread, so Moisson Montréal signed a long-term partnership with Canada Bread to ensure a constant supply of bread for our organizations. Today, 83% have expressed satisfaction with the freshness of the bread received.*

69% are satisfied with the freshness of fruits and vegetables*
94% are satisfied with the freshness of other food items*

FEEDING OUR FUTURE BBQ

Founded in 2000 by the Sodexo Foundation, the Feeding Our Future program offers free meals throughout the summer to children who usually receive subsidized meals during the school year. In addition to donating foodstuffs that will be used to make those lunches, for the last 14 years, Moisson Montréal has also had the mandate to select day camps that could benefit from this program and maintain a line of communication between the camps and Sodexo. Each summer, Moisson Montréal, in partnership with Sodexo, organizes a day of festivities to celebrate summer. Last year, almost 750 children joined our BBQ!

The Food Recovery Program in Supermarkets

DEVELOPING SUSTAINABLE SOLUTIONS TO END HUNGER

The Food Recovery Program in Supermarkets (FRPS), the first of its kind in Canada, redistributes unsold meat, representing a unique and sustainable solution to the problem of food waste and food insecurity. Moisson Montréal developed the program in October 2013 and was mandated by Food Banks of Quebec to sign agreements with supermarket banners across the province, namely, Provigo, Maxi, Metro and Super C, in order to recover their unsold foodstuffs.

INSPIRING PROJECTS

PILOT PROJECT - RECOVERY PROGRAM WITH MONTREAL'S PUBLIC MARKETS

With steady hikes in the cost of food and increasing demand for food assistance, we can no longer turn a blind eye to food waste. Moisson Montréal and Centre de ressources et d'action communautaire de la Petite Patrie (CRAC-PP) are working with Public Markets of Montréal (MPM) to collect unsold food items from its merchants and vendors.

CRAC-PP sorts and redistributes these foodstuffs to people in need in the Petite-Patrie community. This process ensures that foodstuffs are more efficiently handled, whether it be for distribution or processing, and reduces additional transport costs, ultimately supporting our goal to become more sustainable. Surplus items generated by CRAC-PP are redistributed to Moisson Montréal's accredited organizations in other neighbourhoods. This local initiative is a source of pride, as it's the first structured program to collect unsold, but still edible, food items from Montreal's public markets.

This pilot project, which is currently financed in whole by MPM, was launched on June 21 and will operate until September 2016, when an assessment will determine how it can be deployed in other public markets and what kind of additional financing will be required. Our mid-term goal for the program is to sell a portion of processed food items via the CRAC-PP community grocery store in order to start generating profits.

A CENTRAL DATABASE FOR OUR ORGANIZATIONS

We were approached by our partner organizations after the closure of the central database for Christmas baskets in Fall 2013. The central database, which enables us to better identify the specific needs of individuals who use our organizations, will be relaunched in time for the 2016 Feed The Holiday Spirit campaign. The timing ensures that this year's Christmas baskets will be fairly distributed to those in need during the busiest season.

CONSTRUCTION OF AN IN-HOUSE LABORATORY

Thanks to our food recovery program with supermarkets, Moisson Montréal now distributes frozen meat to our member organizations. But this means increasingly higher operating costs for preventative testing that must be conducted in an external laboratory. We thus evaluated the possibility of building an in-house lab to reduce those costs in the long term and ensure better quality control of the food items we distribute. This service could also eventually be offered to our member organizations at minimal cost. Thanks to the support of generous donors, the in-house laboratory will open in Fall 2016.
