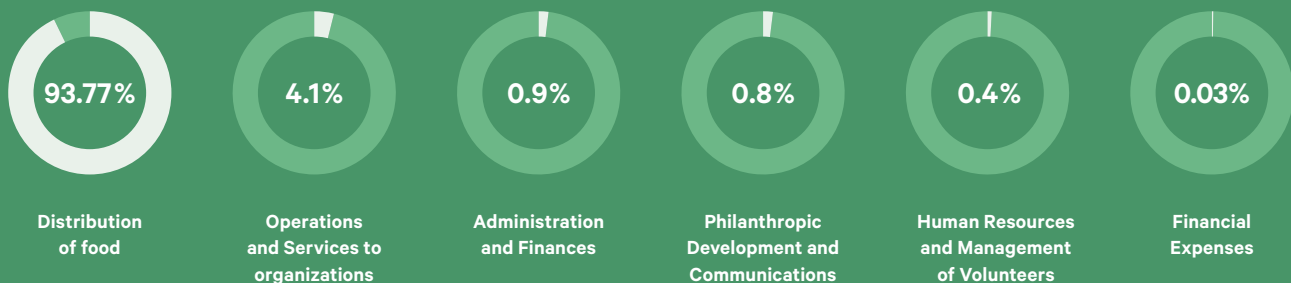

Message from our Leaders



RICHARD BLAIN — President

I am extremely happy with the yearly review for 2016-2017, a year which saw the consolidation of the mutual aid network in the fight against hunger, as well as a greater emphasis on the quality, not just the quantity, of the food redistributed by Moisson Montréal.

First and foremost, Moisson Montréal welcomed new members to its management team. Energetic, innovative and collaborative, the management has expanded the scope of the organization's social goals. We asserted our desire to be key players in the vast network of food security by playing a more active community role. By being more attentive to our accredited community organizations, we were better able to assess their needs and their interests. In order to better serve local community networks and collaborate more effectively with our accredited organizations, we organized a special work meeting with them in February 2017 and we allocated a second seat on our board of directors specifically for our accredited organizations. This gesture is the first in a new series of exchanges.

Striving for continuous improvement, we contemplated the qualitative aspects of our mission. In response to our beneficiaries' specific food needs, we assessed and improved the nutritional value of the food we distribute, made Christmas baskets with low-allergy foods and sorted meat products based on cultural preferences.

Beyond that, Moisson Montréal maintains an extremely active role throughout the province. In addition to the 1,352 metric tons of food distributed by the provincial network to the other 18 "Moissons" in Québec, Moisson Montréal collected and gave them 1,928 additional metric tons. Furthermore, 383 metric tons were supplied to food banks in other provinces (Ontario, New Brunswick and Alberta). During the past fiscal year, over 30% of all food donations were shared outside of Montréal.

We work tirelessly every day to ensure the sustainability of Moisson Montréal. Many activities were held in order to ensure continued financing. These include: appointing a spokesperson, actress Élise Guilbault, as well as establishing a committee of young professionals: the Young Allies. We are developing new projects and working hard to implement effective strategies for the next three years.

I would like to thank the staff at Moisson Montréal, who work tirelessly day after day, to carry out our mission, as well as all the volunteers who support us, including the members of the board of directors who generously donate their time and experience.

Moisson Montréal heads a vast network focusing on food security in Montréal and is a leading figure among 18 other "Moissons" in Québec. DUX 2017 AWARD

Moisson Montréal was awarded the 2017 DUX Prize in the Projects Category: Non-Profit Organization for our Food Recovery Program in Supermarkets. This year alone, 1.2 million kg were saved from being wasted, for the benefit of 137,000 individuals suffering from food insecurity every month.



MERCURIADES 2016 – SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AWARD

The *Fédération des chambres de commerce du Québec* has recognized our Food Recovery Program in Supermarkets that allows us to add proteins to our food offerings, while at the same time decreasing food waste substantially. Launched by Moisson Montréal in 2013, this program has rapidly spread throughout Quebec.



GREATER REPRESENTATION ON OUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR OUR ORGANIZATIONS

At the request of several organizations and in the spirit of cooperation, Moisson Montréal has created a second dedicated position on its board of directors for representatives of our accredited organizations.



HIGH IMPACT DISTRIBUTION

In 2016–2017, we distributed 14.4 million kilos of food, representing a value of **80.3 million** dollars.

A study was conducted this year on the qualitative impact of the food collected by Moisson Montréal, revealing the significance of developing partnerships with suppliers of healthier food. A Greener Moisson

In addition to feeding individuals who seek assistance from our accredited organizations, Moisson Montréal's food distribution services also recirculate food that would have otherwise been wasted. Thus, Moisson Montréal also prevents environmental harm, specifically that associated with the production of new food.

THIS YEAR, THE FOOD DISTRIBUTED BY MOISSON MONTRÉAL HELPED PREVENT:

- THE USE OF 27,116 TONS IN EQUIVALENT CARBON (CO₂e TONS), INCLUDING 9,197 CO₂e TONS RELATED TO LANDFILLS;
- THE CONSUMPTION OF MORE THAN 34 MILLION CUBIC METERS OF WATER, INCLUDING MORE THAN 2 MILLION CUBIC METERS OF DRINKING WATER;
- THE USE OF 2,932 HECTARES OF ARABLE LAND.

Moreover, achieving a **level 1** certification in the ICI ON RECYCLE! Recognition Program, created and managed by the RECYC-QUÉBEC government corporation, reveals how much attention Moisson Montréal pays to managing by products and implementing various methods to reduce, reuse and recycle.



FOOD SHARING BETWEEN THE MOISSONS

The provincial association represents the Moissons of Quebec. This year, it made available 1.939 million kg of food to be shared amongst all Moissons. Moisson Montreal has been assigned to operate the provincial food sharing program. Approximately 30% was kept for community organizations in Montréal while the rest was given to the 18 other Moissons. In addition of all food made available by the provincial association, our organization has procured and redistributed 1.929 million kg of food to the other 18 Quebec's Moissons. Moisson Montreal is as much engaged into food waste reduction as in tackling food insecurity.

Campaigns and Events

Our financing events and campaigns allow us to raise funds and obtain the visibility necessary to develop future activities and projects. It also allows us to raise public awareness regarding food insecurity in Greater Montréal.

MOISSON MONTRÉAL CAMPAIGNS AND EVENTS

THE GREAT FOOD DRIVE FOR CHILDREN

→ \$163,000

The purpose of this campaign is to raise money to help children ages five and under in the Greater Montréal area.

Between March 30th and April 16th, 2016, four events marked the campaign: a food drive with the STM, Children's Day, the 5 Years – 5 Chefs auction and a benefit supper.

14TH GOLF CLASSIC

→ \$234,000

On June 16th, 2016, we travelled back in time for our grand vintage golf tournament, with many activities on the green. This event is one of our major sources of financing.

HUNGER DOESN'T TAKE A HOLIDAY

→ \$47,000

During the summer, children no longer have access to the meals provided by their schools, so certain families must turn to various food banks. This is where Moisson Montréal comes in, holding fundraisers. We also aim to raise public awareness of this reality.

FEEDING OUR FUTURE

This nationwide program was first launched by the Sodexo Foundation in 2001. Since 2011, Moisson Montréal has been a proud partner for the city of Montréal. This program provides free lunches during the summer to children in need. In 2016, nearly 40,000 free meals were distributed to 715 kids from 12 day camps.

FEED THE HOLIDAY SPIRIT

→ \$35,000

Between October 15th and December 15th, 2016, 242 companies and individuals participated in raising money and non-perishable food in our annual drive. As well, 20,000 Christmas baskets, 6,800 emergency bags, 10,000 snack bags, and 3,024 turkeys (thanks to generosity of the Marcelle and Jean Coutu Foundation), were distributed.

We are particularly grateful to Prével (Bassins du Havre), Emballages CRE-O-PACK International, RBC Credit Approval Centre, Allstate Social Fund, the Casino de Montréal and the Dicom Transportation Group.

DIRECT MAIL FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGNS

→ \$355,000

This year, our cherished donors answered three appeals for donations. We thank you for your trust.

CHRISTMAS AT LA RONDE — \$10,600 ♥

For the 4th consecutive year, visitors were encouraged to bring food donations to receive a 60% discount on their admission to the amusement park.

COME SING CHRISTMAS — \$4,350 ★

The Agora Orchestra and *ICI Musique* held a free concert at the St-Jean-Baptiste Church, where spectators were encouraged to make contributions. All proceeds went to Moisson Montréal.

CP HOLIDAY TRAIN — \$18,500 ♥

The Canadian Pacific Holiday Train, a fundraising campaign across Canada, stopped at the Beaconsfield Station where nearly 3,000 spectators were eagerly anticipating its arrival and donated in great numbers.

DRIVE AWAY HUNGER — \$14,500 ♥

Annual fundraiser organized by Farm Credit Canada (FCC) and partners, including BDO, in their fight against hunger. Volunteers and partners of FCC collected food and donations in support of food banks across the country.

(THE) EXTRA HELPING FOOD DRIVE! — \$26,400

Clients and employees of the Loblaw Companies donate food and money every year to restock the shelves of various food banks.

GENEROUS WINES OF THE SAQ in partnership with FBQ — \$144,000 ♥

Through the Generous Wines campaign, held over one weekend by the *Société des alcools du Québec*, \$1 for every bottle of white wine sold was donated by the SAQ to Food Banks of Quebec. SAQ customers were also invited to make additional donations.

LOLÉ YELLOW LABEL — \$5,650

All the profits from the coats donated to the LOLÉ YELLOW LABEL program were given to Moisson Montréal.

MANOIR OUTREMONT — \$1,650

Since 2010, a group of residents organize each year a sale of artisanal and knitted products.

MEDIA'S BIG FOOD DRIVE — \$207,000 ♥

The general public was called upon to donate money and food in order to make holiday grocery baskets. We would like to thank the generous Friends of the Media's Big Food Drive, the Jean Coutu Group, Maxi, Provigo and Via Capitale.

OLYMEL — \$10,000 ★

As part of the *Operation Feeding the World Together*, Moisson Montréal received this very generous donation.

OMNI HOTELS — \$7,500 ★

As part of the *Say Goodnight to Hunger* program, the Omni Hotels donated a specific amount from every online booking to Moisson Montréal.

RECETTES EN POT — \$5,200 ★

Working together, we distributed Recettes en Pot jars as corporate gifts to volunteers, and we put them up for sale. For each jar that was sold, Recettes en Pot gave 50% of its profits as well as 900 meals to Moisson Montréal.

SAVE IT FORWARD — \$10,500

The Loblaw Companies ran a program encouraging customers to use coupons to save on their grocery purchases. For every coupon used, the company made a donation to Moisson Montréal.

SIAL CANADA — \$4,300 ★

Moisson Montréal was present at the International Food Exhibit and collected both perishable foods and non-perishable items.

SOCIÉTÉ DES CASINOS DU QUÉBEC ACTIVITIES — \$32,500 ♥

Loto-Québec, the *Société des casinos du Québec* and the *Casino de Montréal* have been our partners for many years. Their employees greatly support Moisson Montréal by volunteering on their days off and through various fundraising initiatives.

SPECIALTY FOOD EXPO — \$760 ★

Beyond just raising awareness about our mission, a reusable bag was offered at our stand for donations of \$10 or more.

STUFF A TURKEY — \$2,500 ★

GSOFT created an online game, where the goal was to stuff a turkey as fast as possible using different foods. For each game played, GSOFT donated a specific amount to Moisson Montréal.

SUBWAY — \$10,000 ★

During their National Sandwich Day, with every purchase of a sandwich and drink at a participating location, Subway customers were offered a second sandwich, as well as one meal to be donated to Food Banks Canada.

TIM HORTONS — \$7,900 ★

This year, during the Holiday Season, Tim Hortons raised funds to benefit Moisson Montréal at a Christmas market.

Food Recovery Program in Supermarkets

Since 2013, we at Moisson Montréal have been recovering unsold, but still safe to eat, food from supermarkets. This pioneer program is rapidly expanding throughout Quebec.

The Food Recovery Program in Supermarkets perfectly embodies our two-fold mission:

1. Provide easier access to better nutrition
2. Participate in the development of sustainable solutions

The Food Recovery Program in Supermarkets allows us to accomplish two things simultaneously:



**INCREASE
OUR MEAT SUPPLY**

- + For families living with food insecurity, while meat is very nutritious, it is also quite expensive.
- + Our accredited organizations were buying meat to feed their recipients, straining their budgets.

REORGANIZING OUR DISTRIBUTION PROCESS

Depending on user traffic, collecting food from our warehouse was occasionally long and onerous. And so, in order to answer the multiple requests from our accredited community organizations, we thoroughly re-assessed our distribution process. Easy access to our premises and a simplified way to collect food are key factors in reducing food waste. Henceforth, organizations can place their orders in advance. This new system allows them to select what they need ahead of time. Their orders are then prepared and ready for efficient pick up, reducing wait time and simplifying distribution.

Upcoming Projects

At Moisson Montréal, we constantly strive to refine our services and increase our impact. Here are just a few of our upcoming projects for this year:

STRENGTHENING OUR TIES WITH OUR ORGANIZATIONS

Following a work meeting with our accredited organizations held in February of last year, we decided to repeat this event once or twice a year. The next work meeting will be held in October 2017 and will focus on financing and creating greater synergies with accredited community organizations.

DECREASING TRANSPORTATION COSTS FOR FOOD PICKUP

A feasibility study is also being conducted to determine possible ways of improving food transportation between Moisson Montréal and accredited community organizations, a large number of which are located in the same neighbourhoods. Setting up a few distribution centres per neighbourhood, or establishing transportation routes through neighbourhoods could significantly decrease transportation fees for the organizations, allowing them to use their funds to provide direct services for those in need.

WORKING TOWARDS A FOOD-PROCESSING UNIT

Thanks to the financial support from the Society for the Celebrations of Montréal's 375th Anniversary, a study is currently being conducted to assess the feasibility of a food-processing unit. Such a unit would enable Moisson Montréal to extend the shelf life of food, while providing a wider range of quality products to its organizations. This study will take into consideration the common interest of this program for Moisson Montréal, as well as the Greater Montreal food aid network.

STRATEGIC PLANNING 2020

Over the coming year, Moisson Montréal will initiate a new strategy to define its goals for the next three years. This approach will include extensive consultations with accredited community organizations and supporters of food security.

By working together, we can maximize the impact of each dollar we receive for the fight against food insecurity.
