

MESSAGE FROM OUR LEADERS



Richard Blain – President

I am thrilled to share with you that Moisson Montréal ended 2017–2018 in good financial health, despite the scale, complexity and continuous nature of our challenge: to bring food security to everyone in Montréal.

Moisson Montréal has increased its efforts to find sustainable solutions to ending hunger. The organization works closely with other Moisson food banks in Quebec and the other provinces on various projects and funding campaigns. It has cemented relationships with its 241 accredited community agencies to understand their specific issues and meet their needs. This year, Moisson Montréal has also invested in Montréal's community life by participating in a series of 20 round tables on food issues. Further, receiving the mandate for the Diagnosis of Current Practices in Food Assistance in Montréal speaks to our organization's involvement in our society and its ecosystem.

While food donations rose by 8% this year, in a survey given to our partner organizations as part of our strategic planning shows that we are only meeting 60% of their food needs. These worrisome results reveal the true scale of food insecurity in Montréal.

Counteracting this concern was our joy at receiving a gift from the Society for the Celebration of Montréal's 375th Anniversary and its Board of Governors. Their grant of over \$800,000 allowed us to conduct two feasibility studies and will enable us to build a fruit and vegetable processing

plant and purchase a fourth refrigerated truck to ensure the roll-out the Food Recovery in Supermarkets Program.

Moisson Montréal's Board of Directors has revised its strategic governance policy by implementing a development and evaluation system for directors. The Board welcomed two new recruits: Brunilda Reyes, from a community agency, and Adélaïde Israeli. I am proud and grateful for the profound and consistent commitment of the members of our Board of Directors. They all play an important role in Moisson Montréal's success.

I would also like to extend my deepest thanks to the employees of Moisson Montréal. Day after day, their dedicated work helps Moisson Montréal fill empty plates. I also thank our volunteers for their unwavering support, as well as our monetary and food donors. You are outstanding partners!

Richard D. Daneau – Executive Director

What an extraordinary year! To summarize briefly: Moisson Montréal collaborated even more closely with our accredited organizations; we were able to make a surplus contribution of more than \$5 million of food and we became more actively involved in the Montreal food ecosystem.

Our work meetings with our partner community agencies, *Les Grands Échanges*, sparked great interest and even greater participation. Together, we addressed complex issues in order to find lasting solutions.

The renewed support of our volunteers permitted us to improve considerably our level of service and to reduce our operating costs. We are now working to develop different types of "professional" volunteering opportunities to complement the traditional volunteering activities that take place at our workstations.

Moisson Montréal's positive environmental impact keeps improving. This year we saved 16 million kg of food from waste, half of which would have been destined for landfill. Not only was \$86 million of food donated directly to community organizations, but this contribution also helped foster social reintegration and facilitated the provision of care and essential services to nearly 137,000 people in Montreal alone.

Together, we make a profound difference in the lives of many of the most vulnerable people in the metropolitan area. It is with passion and humility that we undertake to better respond to the needs of our partner community agencies. They are, after all, the very reason that we exist.

MOISSON MONTRÉAL IN NUMBERS

According to the last Hunger Count conducted in March 2017, Moisson Montréal and its 241 accredited organizations fulfill over 654,000 requests for food assistance each month, and come to the aid of nearly 137,000 Montrealers in need, of whom 41,500 are children. Despite our healthy economy, food insecurity remains a problem in Montréal. The sociodemographic profile of food bank users keeps changing however. Groups made up of children, the elderly and people with an income (whether through employment, pension or otherwise) keep growing.

ONE OF THE 10 CHARITIES WITH THE GREATEST IMPACT

Charity Intelligence Canada named Moisson Montréal one of the Top 10 Impact Charities in Canada, with the highest impact per dollar received. It is with great pride that we accepted this prestigious recognition, which reflects the extent of Moisson Montréal's social impact and it demonstrates that the donor makes a real difference with its gift.



RECORD AMOUNTS OF FOOD REDISTRIBUTED

While we have only been able to meet 60% of our accredited organizations food needs, Moisson Montréal was able to increase its food offer by 8%, for a total close to 16 million kilograms of food distributed to its entire network. These donations represent savings of nearly \$86 million for Montréal's vast food support network. They also have a significant environmental benefit as they have prevented millions of kilograms of perishable foods from ending up in landfills.

No one is immune from the situations that can lead to food insecurity, whether through unemployment, family breakdown or otherwise. Moisson Montréal enters people's lives when they most need help.

Every day, employees and volunteers come to Moisson Montréal, ready to work together to fight food insecurity and find sustainable solutions. During the 2017–2018 fiscal year, 11,012 volunteers worked 97,352 volunteer-hours to support our operations.

Varied volunteer needs

Every day, in addition to Moisson Montréal's staff, on average 60 volunteers step in to keep the organization running smoothly. Their support is not only deeply appreciated, it is vital. Without it, Moisson Montréal would be unable to successfully fulfill its mission.

There are several areas within Moisson Montréal where the assistance of volunteers is invaluable. We also rely on interns to help us with certain administrative matters. We are currently considering creating a pool of volunteers with professional experience to support us in the development and implementation of several management projects.






OUR ORGANIZATIONS

Moisson Montréal spearheads food collection efforts for Montréal's emergency food network. This year, close to \$ 86 M worth of food was distributed to some 241 Moisson Montréal's accredited organizations and other foodbanks that fight poverty by providing food assistance. This results in considerable savings for the network, which in turn can then be allocated to direct services to individuals in need.

According to the 2017 Hunger Count, nearly **137,000 people**, including **41,500 children**, required food aid in the count's reference month. The accredited organizations take on the enormous task of orchestrating and answering these calls for help.

Order preparation

In order to accelerate the weekly collection of food at Moisson Montréal for the 241 organizations, a dry goods order (or preorder) preparation service was developed and implemented during the year. Given the very favourable comments made by the community agencies during the *Les Grands Échanges* work meetings, Moisson Montréal will continue preparing preorders, including fresh produce (fruit and vegetables) and frozen goods.

This new food distribution method helps the community agencies reduce their weekly collection expenses. It also lets them choose the food items and amounts they need, thus reducing waste and increasing the network's social impact.

Who benefits from the assistance provided by Moisson Montréal?

Moisson Montréal's accredited organizations are committed to fighting poverty and social exclusion. Each community agency offers food assistance, with a large proportion of the food being provided by Moisson Montréal.

Each person who uses these services has a unique and compelling story. The organizations orchestrate and deliver their services taking into account the particular needs of each individual. The same is true for food services, which can take several forms, including food baskets, soup kitchens, meal services, community kitchens, community grocery stores and more.

Accueil Bonneau resident

The father of a 10-year-old boy, Daniel fell into a deep depression after the loss of his mother and the separation from his wife. He lost the will to live, to work, and even the will to eat. Staying in hotel rooms, and paying by credit card, he soon ran out of money and wound up on the street. At the shelter, it was suggested he go to Accueil Bonneau to seek housing. With great effort and courage, he began working in Accueil Bonneau's kitchen. He began with small jobs before succeeding in finding full-time employment. His great pride is being able to welcome his son into his home and spend time with him. He is able to put money aside and now dreams of a two-bedroom apartment in Rosemont, where he can watch his son grow up.







A SUSTAINABLE MOISSON

A vast majority of food distributed by Moisson Montréal is recovered rather than purchased. Moisson Montréal endeavours to recover the food items just before they expire, to redirect them within the food security network. In doing so, the organization keeps millions of kilograms out of food from ending up in landfills, preventing the resulting environmental impact that failure to do so would entail. This approach reflects our will to find sustainable solutions to food insecurity.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ICI ON RECYCLE!

Moisson Montréal participates in the ICI ON RECYCLE! program launched by the Government entity RECYC-QUÉBEC, which highlights organizations efforts to repurpose waste. By achieving level-2 certification, Moisson Montréal has proven its ability to effectively reduce, reuse, recycle and repurpose waste products. The organization is working steadily toward achieving the third and highest level of certification.



Carbon footprint

With the goal of protecting the environment, Moisson Montréal will be assessing the carbon footprint of its activities over the next year. This assessment will determine the organization's actual environmental impact and identify concrete improvement targets for improvement.

Recovering food items destined for landfills

According to the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, 40% of food produced is lost between the farm and the plate.

At Moisson Montréal, nearly 50% of the food it recovers is perishable, meaning it has a very short life.

Securing this food at the right moment means we can deliver nearly 8 million kilograms of perishable food to individuals in need rather than consigning it to landfills. In this way, Moisson Montréal demonstrates its continued commitment to sustainable development.

Healthy eating habits

Just because people are in need it doesn't mean they don't have the right to healthy food.

Moisson Montréal questions the practice of distributing certain types of ultra-processed and unhealthy foods. We have discussed with other community agencies how best to fight food insecurity and promote long-lasting and healthy eating habits.

With help from Mitacs, a non-profit research organization, Moisson Montréal is exploring and revising its food categorization system. Working with Santé Publique, Moisson Montréal hopes to find a way to promote healthy eating while still focusing on its fundamental mandate.

FOOD RECOVERY IN SUPERMARKETS PROGRAM (FRSP)

Launched in 2013 by Moisson Montréal, the Food Recovery in Supermarkets Program has proven its merit and is now underway throughout Quebec. Moisson Montréal recovers unsold consumables from supermarkets and redistributes them to serve Montrealers in need.

CAMPAIGNS AND EVENTS

Funding is the main ongoing challenge to ensuring Moisson Montréal's continued sustainability. Fundraising campaigns and events provide significant funds to the organization. They also help increase our visibility and educate the public about the problems caused by food insecurity.

15th Golf Classic - \$275,000

The well-attended vintage golf tournament was a trip back in time! Several activities took place on the site on June 15, 2017, making the event one of our main sources of funding.

7th edition of The Great Food Drive for Children - \$227,000

The goal of this campaign is to educate people about how food insecurity impacts the development of children aged five and under. For greater efficiency, the Great Food Drive for Children was jointly organized and run with Moisson Rive Sud.

Between April 1st and 30th, 2017, three events took place to highlight the campaign: Children's Day, the "Chef at Home" auction and the benefit supper.

We gratefully acknowledge our sponsors Provigo/Maxi and Scotts.

Hunger Doesn't Take a Holiday - \$87,000

During the summer, when children no longer have access to meals provided by the school system, some families must turn to local food banks. This is when Moisson Montréal's fundraisers become so important. During this period we also work to raise public awareness of this reality.

Part of the campaign was the fifth annual food and funds collection at La Ronde, which raised \$21,900.

Many thanks to La Ronde for its unwavering support.

Feeding the Future - \$5,000

This nationwide program was first launched by the Sodexo Foundation in 2001, and Moisson Montréal has been the City of Montréal's main partner since 2011. This program provides free lunches during the summer to children in need. In 2017, nearly 37,000 free meals were distributed to 915 children at 12 day camps.

Moisson Montréal is grateful for the generosity of Olymel, Sodexo and the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts.

Feeding the Holiday Spirit - \$138,000

From November 1 to December 31, 2017, some 250 companies and individuals helped collect money and non-perishable food items for our annual campaign. More than 16,000 holiday food baskets were made and, thanks to the Fondation Marcelle et Jean Coutu, 2,800 turkeys were distributed.

Meanwhile, the "Multiplions les dindes" sub-campaign for micro-donations was launched in December 2017. The public was invited to make a donation during the holiday season, symbolically giving a turkey to those in need.

Atelier de Joël Robuchon - \$39,000

A new addition to Moisson Montréal's calendar, this gastronomic evening took place on March 14, 2018, at L'Atelier de Joël Robuchon at the Casino de Montréal. The unprecedented culinary event afforded guests a spirited and memorable experience.

Our thanks to the partners who made this event possible: Montreal Airport Marriott In-Terminal Hotel and the Casino de Montréal.

Direct mail fundraising campaigns - \$379,000

This year, our cherished donors who are committed to the cause of food insecurity and seek to assist us in alleviating it, participated in three campaigns for donations. We sincerely thank you for your loyalty.

Moisson Montréal is fortunate to be able to count on several partners that rally participants to the food insecurity cause throughout the year. Here are a few of their fundraising events:

Académie des Sacrés-Cœurs - \$1,459

The students and staff sold cookie mix in jars in December, with proceeds going to Moisson Montréal.

Demers Beaulne - \$6,927

The accounting firm employees gathered for happy hour during the holidays, donating all the proceeds to our organization.

Prével Bassins du Havre holiday campaign - \$7,650

Once again this year, Prével invited its partners to make a donation to fight food insecurity during the holidays. The company generously doubled the collected amount.

Every Plate Full - \$4,450

We would like to thank Food Banks Canada for their national Every Plate Full campaign, which was held from May 23 to June 9, 2017, to fight hunger during the summer meal gap.

Save It Forward - \$34,088

Loblaw Companies stores gave their customers coupons to save on their grocery bill and made a donation to Moisson Montréal for every coupon used.

Omni Hotels - \$15,000

Omni Hotels gave us a generous donation through their "Say Goodnight to Hunger" campaign.

The population was asked to donate money or food staples between November 27 and December 24, 2017. Special thanks to the friends of the campaign: the Jean Coutu Group, Maxi, Provigo and Via Capitale.

Purolator Tackle Hunger with the Montréal Alouettes - \$9,674

Once again Moisson Montréal attended a Montréal Alouettes game on September 17, 2017, and with Purolator's help, collected donations and food staples with Purolator's help.

Lolë Yellow Label - \$2,043

The population was invited to donate gently worn coats to the Lolë Yellow Label program. All proceeds from the coat sales were donated to Moisson Montréal.

Marche aux flambeaux - \$2,447

A large crowd gathered for the torchlight procession organized by La Société du Développement de l'Avenue du Mont-Royal. Participants were invited to donate money or food staples to Moisson Montréal in exchange for a torch.

Subway - \$12,500

For every sandwich sold in participating stores, Subway generously offered customers a second sandwich and donated the equivalent of a meal to Food Banks Canada during National Sandwich Day.

CP Holiday Train - \$18,158

A Canada-wide campaign, the CP Holiday Train made a stop at the Beaconsfield train station where nearly 3,000 people were awaiting its arrival. Moisson Montréal was onsite to collect donations.

Generous Wines of the SAQ in partnership with the FBQ - \$156,320

The Generous Wines campaign took place over a weekend. Société des alcools du Québec (SAQ) customers were invited to make a donation at the cash register. The SAQ gave \$1 to Food Banks of Quebec for every bottle of white wine sold.

STRATEGIC PLANNING

As part of its governance requirements and to assist it in planning for the future, Moisson Montréal conducted a strategic planning exercise for the 2017–2020 period. Led by the Board of Directors, this exercise included a broad consultation of our employees and our community agencies.

This consultation revealed that while the community organizations are very satisfied with the support provided by Moisson Montréal, our organization only met 60% of their food needs.

These are the guidelines for our strategic plan over the next few years:

- Improvement in the quantity and variety of food distributed to the organizations, and optimization of the supply network and the performance of the distribution network
- Establishment of a structured high-performing financing plan and foster a culture of philanthropy within the organization
- Development close partnerships with the accredited organizations
- Strengthen operational synergies with the other Quebec Moissons and complementary organizations
- Consolidation of the organization

SIGNIFICANT PROJECTS

MOISSON MONTRÉAL AIMS TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF ITS SERVICES, AS WELL AS ITS IMPACT ON THE MONTRÉAL COMMUNITY. THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS, WHICH ARE OR WILL BE UNDERWAY IN 2018–2019, MERIT PARTICULAR ATTENTION.

Improving the supply of fruit and vegetables

The Society for the Celebration of Montréal's 375th Anniversary and its Board of Governors announced a strategic investment in Moisson Montréal enabling it to build a fruit and vegetable processing plant on the premises and to purchase a fourth refrigerated truck. Thanks to this generous donation, Moisson Montréal will be able to offer hundreds of thousands of additional kilograms of fruit, vegetables and meat to Montréal families in need.

As a result, a larger quantity of better quality food will be distributed, fostering healthier eating habits. The processing plant will also have a positive environmental impact, as it will allow Moisson Montréal to extend the shelf life of large quantities of fruit and vegetables that would otherwise have ended up in landfill. The new refrigerated truck will maximize the collection of meat from grocery stores not yet participating in the Food Recovery in Supermarkets Program.

Revitalization of community life

Moisson Montréal is continuing its efforts to strengthen ties with its accredited organizations, while at the same time increasing its participation in community life.

It organized its first discussion forum called Les Grands Échanges in October 2017, with the intention of repeating these forums with its community agencies. The first meeting dealt with broad notions of philanthropy. The organizations in attendance expressed their interest in attending two such meetings per year.

In addition, Moisson Montréal increased its presence and participation in the community by taking part in several other round table discussions. Whether with these organizations, large research foundations or other Moisson in the Greater Montreal Area, Moisson Montréal is committed to taking a leadership role against food insecurity.

Assessing current food security practices

A Moisson Montréal initiative in partnership with Regroupement Partage and the Table de concertation sur la faim et le développement social du Montréal Métropolitain, aims to draw an accurate portrait of current food insecurity conditions on the Island of Montréal. The goal is to identify and categorize all organizations fighting food insecurity on the Island, and to determine possible synergies and/or duplication of services.





Lastly, in an ongoing effort to limit food waste and to encourage synergies, Moisson Montréal redistributed more than 3 million kilograms of food to 18 other Moisson food banks in Quebec, and elsewhere in Canada.
